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## TNBC Foundation Helps Jacobi Medical Center Expand Renowned Patient Navigator Program

Expert and Individualized Care to Those in Need

(**Bronx, New York**) – The Breast Health Center at Jacobi Medical Center, part of the New York City Health and Hospitals Corporation (HHC), has reached several milestones that will improve care for Bronx patients, including the expansion of its renowned patient navigator program.

Additional funding from the Triple Negative Breast Care Foundation has allowed Jacobi to augment its Patient Navigator Program. The Center has received a two-year grant to fund an additional navigator who will be specially trained to assist women suffering from a triple negative diagnosis and the challenges these patients often experience in their treatment options.

Studies show between 15% to 20% of breast cancer patients are diagnosed with Triple Negative Breast Cancer. Because this cancer has no hormone receptors it can lead to difficulty in finding effective options for treatment. Beyond providing needed patient support, navigators undertake extensive community outreach and provide education to build disease awareness along with the services and treatment options that are available.



The Center has tapped Cindy Tavarez (pictured) to fill this role. Cindy's responsibilities will include navigating Triple Negative patients through their treatment regimen and coordinating outreach about this type of cancer to the surrounding community.
